Deadline

All entries and payments must be received by **Saturday, June 2, 2018**. Late entries, if accepted, will be charged a **DOUBLE ENTRY FEE. NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN.**

Eligibility

Events are offered to all ages - Tots through Adults

All skaters entering this competition must be registered individual members of ISI and must have their tests registered with ISI at the level they wish to compete.

All memberships and tests will be verified and if found not to be eligible, refunds will not be given. Test must be registered by June 2, 2018.

Rules

This competition will be conducted in accordance with the guidelines contained in the current 2016 ISI Handbook along with all current 2016 Rule Revisions effective September 1, 2016.

Team Points

All events receive **1** participation point plus the Placement points below:

1 st Place = 5 points	4 th Place = 2 points
2 nd Place = 4 points	5 th Place = 1 point

3rd Place = 3 points

All Team Compulsory and Synchronized team events will receive **5** Participation points plus the Placement points below:

1 st Place = 25 points	4 th Place = 10 points
2 nd Place = 20 points	5 th Place = 5 points

3rd Place = 15 points

Verification

The information on the entry form must be accurate and complete. Inaccurate and/or Incomplete forms will be returned. **There will be a \$20.00 fee for any changes made to your original entry form.**

Registration and Music

Each competitor must check in at the registration desk located inside the lobby. Please check in and turn in your music *at least one hour before your scheduled event*. If the competition is running ahead of schedule, an event may begin earlier than its scheduled time. **Please use CD's only.** CD's are to be clearly labeled with the skater's name, age, event, and rink they are representing. There should be no more than one program per CD. No CD-RW's please. All CDs may be picked up at the registration desk after your event.

Schedule of Events

The event schedule will be sent to each rink and posted on our website, www.lasvegasice.com approximately two weeks prior to the event. A revised schedule will be posted prior to the start of the competition. Judges schedule will be emailed to each coach two weeks prior to the event. Please contact the Competition Director as soon as possible if any changes need to be made.

Judging

All coaches with skaters participating in our event must be current ISI Professional members. Each participating rink is required to supply an appropriate number of certified judges. All Professional memberships and certifications levels will be verified through the ISI office. There will be a hospitality room open to all judges.

Awards

All skaters participating in the competition will receive a medal. Medals will be presented after each event result is posted during the competition. The winning rinks will receive TEAM TROPHIES!

Rink Size

The competition will be held on the North Rink - an NHL Rink, 200' by 85' with rounded corners.

Tots 1-4

Tots must be 6 years of age or under as of June 30th, 2018. Programs are one minute in length to music. The program should emphasize the required maneuvers for their test level. They can perform maneuvers from lower levels but not from higher test levels.

Pre Alpha-Delta

Programs are one minute in length and should include test level maneuvers for their test level. Programs must include one additional maneuver from Freestyle 1.

Freestyle 1-10

A program to music with emphasis on the required test level maneuvers from the skater's current freestyle test level. Skaters may perform maneuvers from lower test, but not from higher test levels. Other judging criteria includes: duration, correctness, pattern, posture, rhythm, extra content, and general overall.

Open Freestyle Events

Current ISI Freestyle skaters may compete in the equivalent level for Open Freestyle events without taking any additional tests. Any **USFS skaters** who have not passed any previous ISI Freestyle tests must take the equivalent Open Freestyle test (for information on the test visit www.skateisi.org). If they wish to move up to a higher level, the higher Open Freestyle test must also be passed. Skaters can compete higher than their current test level equivalent, but not lower.

For the Open Freestyle events, **THERE ARE NO REQUIRED MANEUVERS**. Maneuvers from lower levels and any spins from any level may be included, but the jump limitations are as follows:

<u>Level</u>	<u>Jump Limitations</u>	<u>Duration</u>
Bronze	Freestyle 3 and below	2:00 minutes
Silver	Freestyle 5 and below	2:00 minutes
Gold	Freestyle 7 and below	3:00 minutes
Gold Short	Freestyle 7 and below	2:00 minutes
Platinum	Any maneuvers	4:30 minutes
Platinum Short	Any maneuvers	3:00 minutes

Event judging criteria: Correctness of Jumps, Spins, Turns/Edges, Variety of Moves, Music Interpretation, Choreography and Pattern, Presentation, Duration (**No deductions for skating under prescribed time**), and General Overall.

Footwork 1-10

Skater performs a 1.0 minute program to music using various turns and connecting steps with limited jumps and spins. No Spins greater than 3 revolutions and only ½ turn jumps.

Solo Compulsories

Skaters are to perform the following **3 maneuvers** listed in **any order** to a pre-choreographed program with no music. The maneuvers must be performed with a minimal amount of connecting moves. Skaters are limited to **1 minute**, and the full ice surface can be used.

Note: There is no penalty for the quantity of swizzles, wiggles, strokes or crossovers performed in the **Tot-Beta levels**. Only the quality of these maneuvers is judged.

Description of Moves to Be Skated

TOT 1	March in place, fall down/get up, march while moving
TOT 2	2ft. jump in place, single swizzle, beginning 2ft. glide
TOT 3	Teapot (dip), beginning stroking, fwd. swizzles (3 times)
TOT 4	Back swizzles (3 times), back wiggles, 1 or 2 ft. snowplow stop
PRE ALPHA	1 foot glide (either foot), backward swizzles, forward swizzles
ALPHA	Forward crossovers (left over right), forward stroking, 1 ft. snowplow stop
BETA	Back crossovers (left over right), back stroking, t-stop (left foot behind)
GAMMA	Mohawk combo (left forward), outside 3-turn (left foot), hockey stop
DELTA	Inside 3-turn (left foot), bunny hop, lunge
FS 1	Forward spiral (either foot), 2 ft. spin, Waltz jump
FS 2	½ lutz jump, 1 ft. spin, ballet jump
FS 3	Salchow, change foot spin, toe loop
FS 4	Loop jump, sit spin, flip jump
FS 5	Axel, camel spin, lutz jump
FS 6	Double Salchow, spin combination, split jump
FS 7	Double Toe loop, flying camel spin, combination jump
FS 8	Double Flip, flying sit spin, Split Lutz
FS 9	Double Lutz, flying camel/jump sit spin, Axel/Double Loop combo
FS 10	Double Axel/double Toe combo, triple edge jump, death drop

Solo Surprise (All Levels)

This is a “FUN” event where individual skaters are grouped together by age and/or skating levels. The skaters don’t know what they will be asked to do until the event begins. This event usually consists of tasks not necessarily related to skating ability. For higher-level skaters, the task might require performance of some skating skills, but the technical performance of the skating skill is not scored.

Spotlight

Spotlight events do not focus on technical skating maneuvers, but rather, on the overall entertainment value of the program. Please take care in selecting the most appropriate category for the purpose of the program:

- a.) **Character**- a famous, easily identifiable character.
- b.) **Dramatic**- a theatrical performance that sets a mood and evokes an emotional response.
- c.) **Light Entertainment**- to entertain/light hearted.

<u>Level</u>	<u>Maneuver Limitations</u>	<u>Duration</u>
Tot-Delta/Low	FS 1 and below	1:00 minute
FS 1-3/Bronze	FS 4 and below	1:30 minutes
FS 4-5/Silver	FS 6 and below	1:30 minutes
FS 6-7/Gold	FS 8 and below	2:00 minutes
FS 8-10/Platinum	Any maneuvers	2:00 minutes

Skaters may have assistance at the ice door with their prop(s). Skaters are still required to take their starting position within 30 sec. and exit the ice in 30 sec. after their routine.

Spotlight Couples

A spotlight routine of two skaters together performing a program that is entertaining, using costumes and props. Skaters may enter only one Couple Spotlight event. Levels, Maneuver limitations, and duration are the same as the requirements for solo spotlight, however, the level of the event will be determined by the highest level skater.

Spotlight Family

This event is open to 2 or more family members only (of any age and skating level). Program length is 1:30 minutes, and the routines may be fun, entertaining, portraying characters, and using props and costumes.

Artistic (1-10)

Skaters must be Freestyle 1 level and above. There are no props permitted in artistic skating. Skater performs a program to music with emphasis on strong edges, flow, choreography, innovative moves, and music interpretation. There is no score for technical ability in this event.

FS 1-3/Bronze	FS 4 and below	1:30 minutes
FS 4-5/Silver	FS 6 and below	1:30 minutes
FS 6-7/Gold	FS 8 and below	2:00 minutes
FS 8-10/Platinum	Any maneuvers	2:00 minutes

Rhythmic Skating (1-10)

This event requires the use of one hand-held prop (hoop, ball, or ribbon). Additional props are not allowed. Please see specific prop requirements in the ISI Handbook. Skater must maintain control of the prop at all times. The same levels, maneuver limitations, and duration apply as Artistic events.

Shoot the Duck

Skaters will be grouped by approximate age and test level. Timing will begin when skater’s hips are below knee level. Skaters may come up on two feet.

Interpretive

Open to all levels. Music will be provided. Skaters will hear the music 2 times during an on ice warm up and then perform a routine for the judges without any additional assistance. No coaches or parents allowed with the skater during this event. Skate monitors will put skaters on the ice at the appropriate times.

Tot-Delta	FS1 and below maneuvers
FS 1-3/Bronze	FS4 and below maneuvers
FS 4-5/Silver	FS6 and below maneuvers
FS 6-7/Gold	FS 8 and below maneuvers
FS 8-10/Platinum	Any maneuvers

Jump and Spin Teams (2 Skaters)

Two skaters enter the ice as a team. The first skater performs his/her choice of a required jump 2 times, followed by the second skater performing his/her choice of a required spin 2 times. Only the best attempt of each element will be scored. All levels will be performed on half ice. If partners are from different levels, then they must compete in the level of the higher partner. Skaters may skate above their current freestyle test level but not below. **Maneuvers are judged only for technical accuracy, not the difficulty of maneuvers chosen.**

<u>Level</u>	<u>Jump</u>	<u>Spin</u>
Low (Tots-Delta)	2-Foot Hop or Bunny Hop	2-ft Spin
Bronze (FS 1-3)	Half flip or Toe Loop	2-ft or 1-ft spin
Silver (FS 4-5)	Half loop or Axel	Sit spin or back spin
Gold (FS 6-7)	Dbl Salchow or Dbl Toe Loop	Layback or Flying Camel
Platinum (FS 8-10)	Dbl Loop or Dbl Lutz	Flying Sit or Flying Camel-Jump Spin

Jump and Spin Teams (4 skaters)

This event is considered a "created event" for this competition. The event guidelines and judging criteria will not be found in the ISI Handbook. Each team will consist of 4 skaters. For the Jump Teams, each skater will perform one jump twice and the best jump will be judged. For the Spin teams, each skater will perform one spin twice and the best spin will be judged.

Bronze Jump Team: Skaters must be FS 3 or below. The jumps will be: (1) **Waltz Jump**, (2) **Ballet Jump**, (3) **Salchow**, and (4) **Toe Loop**

Silver Jump Team: Skaters must be FS 5 or below. The jumps will be: (1) **Flip**, (2) **Loop**, (3) **Lutz**, (4) **Axel**

Gold Jump Team: Skaters must be FS 7 and below. The jumps will be: (1) **Split Jump**, (2) **Axel**, (3) **Double Sal-chow**, (4) **Double Toe Loop**

Bronze Spin Team: Skaters must be FS 3 or below. The Spins will be: (1) **Two foot**, (2) **One foot (free leg optional)**, (3) **Change Foot Spin**, (4) **Sit Spin**

Silver Spin Team: Skaters must be FS 5 or below. The Spins will be: (1) **Camel**, (2) **Forward sit to back sit**, (3) **Combination spin with one change of foot and one change of position (basic positions only)**, (4) **Back scratch spin**

Gold Spin Team: Skaters must be FS 7 or below. The Spins will be: (1) **Layback**, (2) **Flying Camel**, (3) **Combination spin with one change of foot and change of positions (difficult variations allowed)**, (4) **Combination spin with no change of foot and change of positions (difficult variations allowed)**

Team Compulsories (1-10)

A team of 6-7 skaters compete together on a certain level, each performing one of the 6 or 7 required compulsory maneuvers from that corresponding freestyle level. This team of skaters competes against another team of skaters from the same level. Music is required. Props are permitted for the performance, but are not allowed on the group warm-up time. Maneuvers must be performed in the order listed in the ISI Handbook. In Skaters will be allowed to participate on two different teams, as long as they are not on two teams in the same freestyle level.

Ensemble

This event is open to groups of 3-7 skaters of all levels and ages. Skaters will be judged on the performance value of the program. There are no required maneuvers, no maneuver limitations, and there is no technical score for this event. The group should use music, costumes & props to enhance the theme while creating an entertaining performance. The costume & prop guidelines are the same as for Solo Spotlight events. Props are not allowed on warm-up. Event groups are divided by number of skaters first and then by age, if necessary. Duration: 3 minutes
